**Re: QUALIFIED SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION BOND (QSCB) ALLOCATION**

The New Berlin School District is submitting this letter as application for a \$2,000,000 allocation of Qualified School Construction Bonds. The District seeks any part of the \$2,000,000 request that would be available.

The District will use the QSCB financing to address sanitation sewer issues at our New Berlin West Middle / High School campus. The District is obligated to pay the cost of extending the City of New Berlin sewer to this location. This expenditure meets the *safe and healthful school* criteria

The District has the Borrowing Authority via a Fund 38 Borrowing Resolution approved by the School Board in open session on Monday, June 8. We anticipate approval of this project by the City of New Berlin by the end of the month and for construction to start in about 3 months.

The District is confident that this project will adhere to the "Prevailing Wage" requirements of the Davis-Bacon Act. Every effort will be taken by the selected construction team and project staff to ensure all reporting requirements are met.

This project will fulfill the intended goal of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) by creating or maintain jobs on or near the construction worksite. We feel that our project meets the longer term goal of "reinvesting" in our local community by improving the public infrastructure that serves our citizens in an efficient and sustainable manner.



NOTICE TO THE ELECTORS

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the School Board of the above-named School District, at a regular meeting duly called, noticed, held and conducted on June 8, 2009, adopted a resolution entitled:

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE BORROWING OF NOT TO EXCEED \$2,000,000;  
AND PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION  
PROMISSORY NOTES THEREFOR

Said Resolution was adopted pursuant to the provisions of Section 67.12(12) of the Wisconsin Statutes to authorize a borrowing for the public purpose of paying the cost of sanitary sewer projects at the New Berlin West Middle/High School (the "Project").

Copies of said Resolution are on file in the District office, located at 4333 South Sunnyslope Road, New Berlin, Wisconsin 53151 and may be inspected weekdays, except holidays, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.

Section 67.12(12)(e)2 of the Wisconsin Statutes provides in part that a referendum is required on the question of this borrowing only if a petition is filed within 30 days after this publication signed by at least 7,500 District electors or 20% of the District electors voting for Governor at the last general election, whichever is the lesser. If no such petition is filed, then the Resolution shall be effective without a referendum.
